

Fact Sheet for International Students



The Faculty of Education and Lifelong Learning (INSPÉ) of the Strasbourg Academy spreads across several campuses. The Meinau, Neuhof, and historical campuses are located in Strasbourg. Two other campuses are in Sélestat and Colmar.

The Faculty of Education and Lifelong Learning (INSPÉ) Strasbourg offers different courses

Bachelor Degree options :

Licence Sciences de l'éducation et de la formation (two degrees):

Professorat des écoles

Prepares students for careers in professional training, education, and teaching.

Métiers de la formation et de l'intervention éducative

Prepares students to work in continuing professional education and as socio-professional guidance counselors.

The INSPÉ Strasbourg offers five Masters

Master MEEF 1er degré

Prepares students to teach at the primary school level.

*In addition, the Colmar campus offers a degree in bilingual French/German education.

Master MEEF 2nd degré

Prepares students to teach at the secondary school level (lower and upper).

Master MEEF Encadrement éducatif

Prepares students for a variety of careers in education and inclusion such as Guidance Counselor, Organization Director, advocacy, and inclusion work.

Master Sciences de l'éducation et de la formation

This master's program trains students to design training programs, provide professional support to individuals and groups, and manage educational organizations administratively and pedagogically. It also prepares students for doctoral studies and careers in research and higher education in the field of e

Master CFT (Conception formation technologique)

Prepares students to design learning environments and programs for organizations (schools, companies,...)

**School years are divided into two semesters. The first semester is referred to as S1. The fall semester (September-December) is always indicated by an odd number (S1, S3, or S5) and the spring semester (January- May), is indicated by an even number S2, S4, or S6)*

Internships

Students may complete an internship (for course credit or independently) while at the INSPÉ.

Language Requirement

To ensure academic success, students must have a minimum B1 level in French, as the majority of exams and classes are held in French.

French as a Foreign Language Courses (FLE) (three possibilities):

- French as a foreign language course for 3 ECTS (on a first-come-first-served basis).
- Intensive French as a Foreign Language program (FLE) for incoming students (25 hours of French classes during the last two weeks of August+ coaching for managing everyday life in France (For a fee).
- Extensive French as a Foreign Language program; (30 hours of French classes per semester + cultural outings) (For a fee).

Study Contract / Learning Agreement :

Students must complete a learning agreement detailing their chosen courses and ensuring that they meet the academic requirements of both their home and host institutions.

Accommodation & expenses:

University accommodation

The University can provide accommodation in student residences. Students who wish chose this option must apply for student housing when they submit their online application.

Rent or share a flat

The University can provide information on available housing options. It is then the student's responsibility to find the housing that best suits their needs. (add link)

Services:

1. Orientation Day

The University of Strasbourg organizes an Orientation Day to welcome new students, providing essential information and resources to help them settle in and make the most of their academic experience.

2. Guide de l'étudiant

Each student receives the 'Guide de l'étudiant', a comprehensive handbook that includes important details about campus facilities, academic guidelines, and support services available to help students navigate university life effectively.


Deadlines for submitting applications

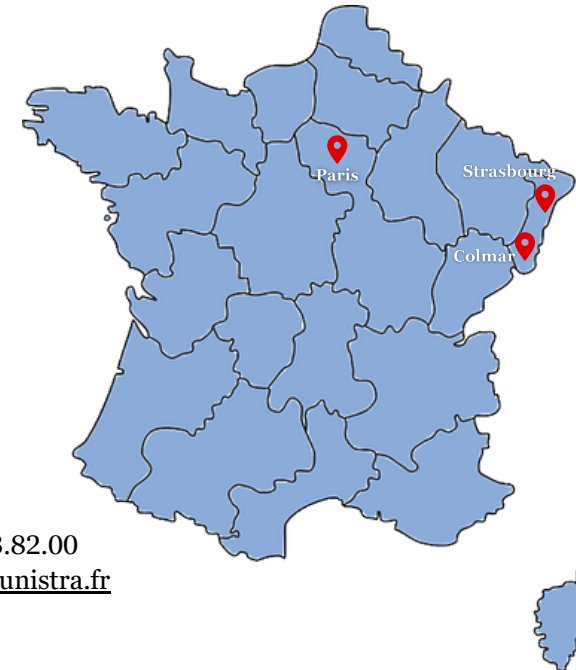
For a mobility in the fall semester / academic year: Mid-May.
